2020 PROVIDENCE RIVER QUAHOG TRANSPLANT SCHEDULED FOR THE FOLLOWING DATE:

**Tuesday, September 15, 2020 Lower Providence River to
Western Greenwich Bay and Bristol Harbor SMA**

- Shellfishermen that assist in dumping the clams into the respective management areas will be paid \$15 per 50-pound bag.
- Shellfishermen that do not assist in dumping the clams will be paid \$10 per 50-pound bag.

Additional Information

- The Providence River Shellfish Transplant will take place between 8 a.m. and noon.
- Shellfishermen wishing to participate in the transplant are asked to complete the fillable W-9 form (necessary to receive payment). This should be done even by those that have participated in past transplants.

- Licensed shellfishermen wishing to participate in the transplant should report to the on-scene DEM Enforcement patrol boat by 8 AM on the day of the transplant. The officers will collect licenses to facilitate accounting.
- Transplanted shellfish will be unavailable for harvest until December 2020.
- A percentage of the clams will be transplanted into Winnapaug Pond Spawner Sanctuary.
- If a delay is implemented due to foul weather, the information will be made available through the Marine Fisheries Listserve rimarinefisheries-subscribe@listserve.ri.gov and the Water Quality Closure Hotline (401) 222-2900.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)
